Rainbow Mates

The group meets in Salisbury at Twelve25 Youth Enterprise Centre on a fortnightly basis afterhours. A light dinner is also provided with refreshments. The purpose of the group is to provide young people with a safe and respectful place to explore and express their identity free from judgment and stigma.

The content is driven by the needs of the participants which can include areas such as guest speakers discussing various health related topics, community event planning, discussing current events and media content as well as providing a generalised supportive environment and relaxed atmosphere.

Minister for Youth Meeting

On 9th November some of our team and Youth Advisory committee members attended a youth forum/consultation with the Minister for Youth, the Honourable Zoe Bettison, at the Northern Sound System. We were thankful to have been invited to this event by our friends at the Playford Council!

At the consultation session, young people from the region spoke about current and emerging issues that they saw as priorities, and which they identified as the major challenges facing young people in the Playford Region. These included youth mental health, youth homelessness, physical wellbeing, and emerging issues such as young futures (employment, future opportunities for young people), family instability (e.g. substance abuse, domestic violence, young carers). This event was an amazing opportunity for us to get behind our young people and encourage them to have their voices heard in ways that could directly impact policy and funding allocation in our region. Minister Bettison spoke about the 2015 Youth Strategy for South Australia, a program called Youth Transitions (youth mentoring), and the current year's area of focus of homelessness. Thankyou to Playford Council for hosting this great event and inviting us!





Playford Alive Community Fun Day

On Saturday 21st November Playford Alive had a community fun day to open the new town center and new play ground. There were multiple stall holders there on the day from agencies and small businesses in the area. Cosi from South Aussie with Cosi was the MC for the day with lots of local acts performing and special guest Samantha Jade from X-Factor. Overall it was a very successful day with lots of young people and families coming down to enjoy the day.





Northern Community Ice Forum

With the support of the Mawson Centre and the City of Salisbury, the Northern Health Network and headspace Edinburgh North successfully hosted the Northern Region Ice Forum on Wednesday 25 November 2015 in Mawson Lakes. The Forum, facilitated by Emma Rebellato (Senior Journalist from ABC News), aimed at providing community members, health professionals and other community service providers with an opportunity to learn about methamphetamine (ice) users, the latest epidemiological data, patterns and trends of methamphetamine use and effects, and best practice treatment and intervention options.

- Flinders University's National Centre for Education and Training on Addiction


After the Forum, attendees had the opportunity to participate in a brief Q&A and discuss how to apply current data and research outcomes to improve response to methamphetamine use within the local community.

DV SnapShots is presented in the form of a yearly Conference in South Australia and unites people from all walks of life while providing insight into real life experiences to initiatives being undertaken which aim to reduce domestic and family violence.

"Being able to declare my freedom has now allowed me to work towards my action plan as a White Ribbon ambassador with my team of partners in the DV sector which will be using the right methodologies to implement the correct recommendations to stop the issues occurring in the northern suburbs of Ade-

laide. I hope to expand into other communities around South Australia and other states around the nation using my action plan."




Outdoor Movie Night
