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How to find us

Our address is 66 Victor Crescent, Narre Warren, 3805.

We are in the Casey Business Park.

The sign '66 B1 Casey Business Park' is hidden by a tree.

The building is grey and orange/yellow.

The building is 3 stories tall.

We are on the ground floor.

We are opposite grassland.

We are near a roundabout that takes you to Verdun Drive.

What the entrance looks like:

You will only see our branding if you come from one side.

The branding is on the same side of the building that our office is on.

This is the side closer to Fountain Gate Shopping Centre.

The main entrance to the building has 6 stairs.

The entrance at the back of the building has no stairs.

There is a yellow footpath to show you the way to the back.

There are a few trees surrounding the building.

We are across the road from grassland.

Driving to Narre Warren headspace

- You can take Exit 22 off the Monash Freeway – Narre Warren North Road exit.
- You can come from the Princes Highway.
- There is no parking on-site.
- You will have to find street parking.
- Street parking is parallel parking.
- There is no paid parking.
- There is timed parking.
- There are car parks nearby for other businesses.

Train or Bus to Narre Warren headspace.

- Narre Warren Station is the closest train station to our Centre.
- It will be approximately a 20-minute walk to our Centre from here.
- The 895 is the closest bus stop to our Centre.
- Towards Fountain Gate Shopping Centre, you get off at the Verdun Drive/Victor Crescent stop.
- We are across the road.
- It will take approximately 2 minutes to get to our Centre from this stop.
- Towards Narre Warren South, you get off at the Narre Warren North Road/Victor Crescent stop.
- This stop is across the road from Bunnings.
- It is on the same side of the road as us.
- It is approximately a 4–9-minute walk from here to our Centre.

Reception Area:

- There is only 1 desk at reception.
- There are 20 chairs in the waiting room, some with armchairs and some without.
- There is 1 T.V playing in the waiting room.
- There are information sheets and leaflets you can take.
- There are magazines and books for you to read.
- The desk is 120.5cm tall.
- The doorways are 85.5cm wide.

BATHROOMS

There is 1 bathroom inside our Centre.

This is gender neutral.

There are pads, tampons, and extra toilet paper here.

You can only access this bathroom once you have gone through for your appointment.

There are also male, female and a gender-neutral accessible bathrooms in the building, outside of our center.

These bathrooms are all on the same floor as us.

They are on the same side of the hallway as us as you enter the building.

COUNSELLING ROOMS

- We have 11 counselling rooms.

- They all have at least 3 chairs, a desk and a computer or laptop.
- Not all rooms have windows.
- The windows are tinted.
- There are blinds as well.
- There is 1 group room.
- This group room is used for programs such as pride groups or art therapy.
