How to find headspace Pakenham

Our address is the Corner of Main Street and

McGregor Road, Pakenham, 3810.

It is co-located with the Church.

It is a single building.

We are the building closer to McGregor Road.

Our front door faces Princes Highway.

If you are coming from McGregor Road, you will not see any of the headspace logos.

What the entrance looks like

There is only 1 entrance.

It is facing Main Street/Princes Highway.

There are no stairs.

There is a small lip into the door. It is still accessible.

The entrance is undercover.

There is a green sign that says 'headspace Pakenham' on the front.

There is a maroon and blue shape on either side of the sign.

The headspace sign is green.

There is an opaque glass wall at the front of the building.

The entrance is on the side of this further away from the road.


There is a doorbell to press on the left side of the door to be let into the building.

What the entrance looks like - images



This is the front of the building. You can see the Church on the left.


This is where you enter.



This is the front door.

The doorbell is above the door handle.

What the back of the building looks like - images



This is the back of the building. You can see the Church on the right.

This is what it looks like from McGregor Road.

Driving to Pakenham headspace

You can turn left onto McGregor Road from Main Street.

We are on the immediate left after that.

You can turn left or right onto McGregor Road from Princes Highway.

We are the first left after Main Street.

You can take the Monash Freeway to get to headspace Pakenham.

Take McGregor Road - Exit 28.

We are at the end of McGregor Road before Princes Highway.

We are the last right before Main Street.

There are two entry points for cars.

Before the building and after the building.

Both have car parks.

Getting to Pakenham headspace via Public Transport

There are two bus routes you can take.

If you take the 925 towards Lakeside, get off at McGregor Road/Princes Highway.

If you take the 925 towards Pakenham Station, get off at Lyle Blue Court/Princess Highway. Watch your step here as the road is unmade.

If you take the 926 towards Fountain Gate Shopping Centre, get off at McGregor Road/Princes Highway.

If you take the 926 towards Pakenham Station, get off at Lyle Blue Court/Princess Highway. Watch your step here as the road is unmade.

All these stops are a 3-6 minutes from the centre.

If you take the train, we will be on the Pakenham Line.

Get off at Pakenham Station.

You can take either the 925 or 926 from here.


It will take 20 minutes to walk to the centre from the station.

Walk down Main Street until you reach the centre.

How to get to headspace Pakenham by bus - images



This is the 925 and 926 to Pakenham Station stop at Lyle Blue Court/Princes Highway.



This is the 925 to Lakeside and 926 to Fountain Gate stop at McGregor Road/Princes Highway.

The road is unmade.

There may not be someone at the reception desk.


There are chairs in the waiting room.

There are information sheets and leaflets you can take.


There are 2 counselling rooms visible from reception.

What the bathrooms are like

There are 3 bathrooms.


There is 1 gender neutral bathroom, 1 female bathroom, and 1 male bathroom.

They are at the end of the corridor.

The door to the bathroom says 'Staff Only'. You can enter anyway.


Each bathroom has a mirror, sink, soap, extra toilet paper, and sanitary bins.

What the counselling rooms are like

There are 4 counselling rooms.

They are named after colours: Maroon Room, Dark Blue Room, Orange Room, Dark Green Room.

Each room has a feature wall that matches the colour of the room name.

Each room has a frosted window.

You cannot see in or out.

There are blinds.

- 3 rooms are down the same corridor.
- 2 can be seen from reception.

They all have a desk and at least 3 chairs.

There are sensory toys in each room.
